

## THE STATE PROGRAM IN THE HUMANITIES

State Programs in the humanities were established by NEH in response to the Congressional charge to promote projects that foster increased public understanding and use of the humanities. In launching these programs, the Endowment acted in the belief that our national life is diminished by people's lack of access to, and understanding of, the scholarly disciplines of the humanities, the enduring products of Western civilization, and our local, regional, and national history.

In responding to those concerns, the Endowment supports humanities councils in each of the states. These councils support projects that link the concerns and interests of each state's residents with the more formal world of academic scholarship. The objectives of the state programs are: (1) to provide support through a decentralized decision-making process for humanities projects designed to reach the Nation's adult population; (2) to provide opportunities for citizens to gain an understanding of the humanities as distinct disciplines and forms of knowledge through scholarly activity that extends beyond the classroom and involves direct associations between humanities scholars and the non-student public; and (3) to foster the institutional viability and public accountability of the state humanities council in each state.

By supporting a variety of humanities projects intended for a general audience and selected in a competitive process, state councils give substance to the concept of decentralized grantmaking addressed to local interests and needs. Accordingly, projects are co-sponsored by non-profit organizations, academic and cultural institutions, and ad hoc citizens' groups. The involvement of humanities scholars is required in all projects, and a goal of most projects is to involve scholars and the public in direct interchange. In the majority of projects, both the public and scholars play an active role in project design, implementation and evaluation.

The immediate beneficiaries of these projects are individual teachers, scholars and citizens who are active participants. The intermediate beneficiaries are the organizational and institutional project sponsors. The ultimate beneficiary is the society as a whole.

Each council is composed of scholars and teachers in the humanities, as well as persons broadly representative of the state, including physicians, laborers, civic leaders, businessmen and retired persons. More than 1,100 citizens now serve on state councils.

While many public and private institutions (colleges, universities, museums, historical societies) support humanities activities, none has as its primary goal education in the humanities for general audiences, nor

does any draw upon and unite the collective resources of these institutions to provide sustained education in the humanities for the out-of-school public.

NEH State Programs have helped create an institution in each of the 50 States, the District of Columbia and Puerto Rico, which provides continuing humanities programming developed by and addressed to each state's citizens. State humanities councils have aided the emergence of scholarly fields in the humanities (e.g., oral history; local and community history; bioethics) and the burgeoning interest of Americans in their own culture, heritage, and values. The councils' flexibility permits them to devise or respond to innovative means of reaching the public, either directly or through institutions which serve them, as demonstrated, for example, by their development of scholar-in-residence grants.

Each state council, composed of 18-25 members, submits biennially a proposal which describes its program for the past two years and presents plans for the ensuing two-year period. This proposal is assessed by staff, outside reviewers and panelists and is the basis for National Council recommendations regarding funding levels and conditions. In addition, each state submits a "plan," for approval by the Chairman, which indicates compliance with the public accountability provisions of the 1980 law. Each council is placed in a formal relationship to state government because the state government is given the options of: (a) matching 50% of the Federal base grant or 25% of the total Federal grant and designating the existing State council as a state agency, or (b) appointing four members to the existing council.

After a state council is funded, it then "regrants" its funds to organizations and groups which submit applications to a competitive review process. State councils typically support no more than one-half the cost of a project. The Endowment has a continuing relationship with individual state councils. Staff travels frequently to individual state council meetings and to regional and national meetings, and attends projects supported by the state councils. Staff provides advice about overall program planning, program development initiatives, evaluation procedures, and shares information about other Endowment programs.

To date, the programs in the states have involved and influenced the activities of numerous institutions bearing a relationship to both the public and the humanities. State council projects have been co-sponsored by 1,000 libraries, 800 museums, and 750 historical societies; 2,600 projects have been proposed and co-sponsored by universities, 1,200 by colleges, and 785 by two-year, post-secondary institutions. Many projects have been conducted by a variety of other academic institutions, such as the Fermi Research Laboratory in Chicago and the National Humanities Center at Research Triangle in North Carolina.

Through a shift in the funding cycle and the use of discretionary money in FY 1981 and FY 1982 to supplement grants under the statutory formula, the Endowment has sought to maintain State councils at their FY 1980 levels in order to facilitate extensive self-assessment by the councils and preparation for possible reductions in Federal support.

In FY 1982, the Endowment reached 28 million Americans and involved over 15,000 scholars in the 3,864 re grants it supported through this program. In FY 1982, with \$20,329 million in Federal funding, over 26 million citizens were reached in 3,600 re grants involving over 13,000 scholars. Many state councils have increased the 50 percent cost-share required by law of funded projects. Most are searching for new ways to encourage cash donation and many councils plan to place greater emphasis on pre-packaged programs.

In FY 1983, with \$13.2 million and at an average project cost of \$3,500, state councils will reach approximately 14 million citizens and involve 7,500 scholars in over 1,800 projects. In FY 1982, and FY 1983, the agency will assist state councils in a rigorous evaluation of the programs to determine what approaches could best serve the states at the level of funding available.

In FY 1984, state councils will continue to evaluate their programs in an effort to identify the most effective means of promoting the humanities and of serving the nation's citizens. NEH will continue to encourage increased emphasis upon supporting only the highest quality projects and expanded efforts to raise funds in the private sector.





### EXAMPLES OF SUPPORTED PROJECTS

(i) In 1980, the Louisiana Committee for the Humanities awarded \$30,000 to Tulane University Law School in New Orleans for "The Civil Code — A Humanistic Appraisal," a major scholarly conference and statewide series of community discussion programs which involved scholars from the disciplines of jurisprudence, linguistics, history and philosophy in an analysis of Louisiana's unique legal system — the only state legal system derived from the Napoleonic Code. A subcommittee of the Louisiana Bar Association provided assistance for the project. "Louisiana's Legal History," a follow-up project, was made possible in 1981 by a state council grant of \$13,000 to the Louisiana State Museum for a conference, interpretive publications and a traveling exhibit for the general public. These projects have not only helped to make Louisiana citizens aware of their unique legal heritage, but have also led to modifications in some of the State's law school offerings and have promoted citizen interest in Spain and Haiti, where the legal systems have similar origins. Published materials generated by the two projects will be printed in larger quantities by Tulane University and distributed at its pavillion during the 1984 Louisiana World Exposition in New Orleans.

(ii) "History, Ethics, and Politics: A Conference Based on the Work of Hannah Arendt," was sponsored by Empire State College with funds (\$9,930) from the New York Council for the Humanities. Arendt was the subject of a major retrospective which took place in October, 1981, six years after her death. Noted political theorists, philosophers, thinkers, and writers — including Mary McCarthy, Richard Rubinstein, George Kateb, Bernard Crick, Leon Botstein, Matti Megged, Paul Ricouer, Sheldon Wolin and Elizabeth Young-Bruehl — from the United States, Europe and Israel assessed Arendt's life and work. An overflow audience of more than 500 people gathered at each session over a three-day period to listen to and participate in the spirited discussions, which featured views both admiring and critical of Arendt's ideas.

(iii) The Institute for Humanistic Studies in Ogden, Utah, believes that an important aspect of the humanities is that they can provide knowledge that extends beyond experience and can expose students to the richness and diversity of human culture. This was the purpose of "Japan: An Interdependent Nation," a two-day seminar sponsored by the Institute and funded (\$7,917) by the Utah Endowment for the Humanities. Project organizers noted that Japan is one of America's most important allies and trading partners; yet, as the only non-Western nation among the advanced industrialized countries, Japan's culture is little known in the United States. Over 500 people (200 more than expected) participated in project activities concerning language, literature, history, philosophy, arts and religion of Japan. Workshops and lectures were conducted by Asian scholars from throughout Utah and from Stanford University. The project involved, as well, fruitful collaboration among a number of organizations, including the Utah State Office of Education, the

Consulate of Japan at San Francisco, and the Japanese American Citizens League. The Governor of Utah declared "Japanese Appreciation Week" to coincide with the seminar. The activities attracted numerous secondary school teachers who subsequently developed projects for their own schools.
