## Budget Narrative

FY 1994

## Definite Funds

Definite funds are appropriated by Congress for the programs of the agency's various divisions.

## Treasury Funds

These funds are appropriated by Congress for the NEH as a whole, are allocated to the agency's program divisions at the discretion of the chairman, and must be matched by third party sources. For FY 1994, one-third of the agency's Treasury Funds was allocated to the Division of State Programs in order to assist the councils in their efforts to increase financial support from the private sector.

## Base Grants

As established by the Congressional funding formula, each state council receives $\$ 200,000$ of the definite funds appropriated to the Division of State Programs. Of the remaining funds, forty-four percent is divided equally among the states which have a population of 200,000 or more, and twenty-two percent is allocated to each council on the basis of population. The total is the base grant.

## Chairman's Discretionary Funds (National Fund)

These funds constitute thirty-four percent of the remaining funds noted immediately above. They provide flexibility in the annual funding of the state councils, support their advancement as institutions, and foster excellence and leadership in the national program.

## Matching

The division supplements the treasury offers with definite funds to the state councils in order to enhance their capacity to match gifts from private sector sources and state government.

## \$1 Million Distributed by Population with a Floor of $\$ \mathbf{2 0 , 0 0 0}$

One million dollars is distributed currently to all state councils on the basis of population in order to help balance the equal distribution portions of the Congressional formula. An additional $\$ 452,162$ was used to maintain a floor of $\$ 20,000$ for forty states.

## State and Regional Exemplary Awards

The State and Regional Exemplary Awards offer the state humanities councils an opportunity to implement major statewide or regional projects of their own design that theywould otherwise be unable to supportfom their regular yrant avourds (base grant olus chairman's discretionaryfunds)

## Public Meetings

Since 1986, the enabling legislation has required state humanities councils to conduct "public meetings in the state to allow scholars, interested organizations, and the public to present views and make recommendations" regarding the councils' programs and operations. The legislation also requires the state councils to provide a report on these activities in their applications for NEH support. Each council receives $\$ 10,000$ annually to assist in this effort.

## Equal and Population Distribution of Matching Funds

In FY 1991, state councils' matching offers which were out of line by population were set on a five-year schedule of reductions. In FY 1994, the net total amounted to $\$ 172,300$. These funds were then distributed twothirds by population and one-third equally to 55 state councils.

## Hawai'i and Alaska

The Hawai'i and Alaska councils are awarded fifteen and twenty percent respectively of the base grant as cost of living adjustments.

## American Samoa

An award to the American Samoa committee will be used for planning prior to an application for operational and program support for FY 1995.

## Translation

These funds are used by the Puerto Rico council to help translate proposals, guidelines, and other public documents into English and to assist in the translation of the council's collection of videos.

## Insurance

Through the firm of Seltzer, Serra \& Bonnett, the NEH pays for Comprehensive General Liability Insurance which covers each state council.

## Frankel Awards and Ceremony

The Charles Frankel Prize is awarded each year by the NEH to "honor individuals who have made outstanding contributions to the public understanding of the humanities." Five awards of $\$ 5,000$ each are given.

## Conferences

## Orientation

These meetings provide new council members with an introduction to their responsibilities as trustees of public funds. These include programmatic and fiscal accountability, establishing the council's mission and goals, and evaluation of its programs and services. These meetings also provide new members with the opportunity to meet some of their peers throughout the nation, as well as NEH staff, discuss issues that are inherent in the national State Program, and learn more about the programs of the National Endowment for the Humanities.

## Chairs and Executive Directors

These meetings provide a forum for the volunteer and staff leadership of the state councils to discuss with each other and with the staff of the division and chairman of the NEH the common concerns and interests we share regarding programmatic, financial, and institutional priorities of the individual states and the State Program nationally. These meetings also provide the NEH with an opportunity to acknowledge and showcase the accomplishments of the state councils.

Note: The budget estimate for the 1994 conferences includes travel and honoraria. Other costs, including per diem, lodging, ground transportation, printing, supplies and materials, were paid through the division's 1993 contract with Cygnus Incorporated. All conference costs conform to government-wide regulations.
